Reducing Light Pollution to Enjoy Wildlife by Nicole Byrd

Did you know we have owls in our neighborhood?! We can be good neighbors to them by rethinking our outdoor lighting.

- Instead of bright white lights, use warm tones like yellow or orange.
- Point lights downward instead of straight up or out, and think about fixtures or shields that are designed to help curb excessive light pollution.
- Use a motion sensor setting instead of leaving lights blaring all night.

None of these adjustments are expensive or time consuming. Less light pollution is better for humans' sleep quality and overall health, too. For more information, visit

Q4 PAYMENT DUE (final quarter of 2023) IS DUE SEPTEMBER 1ST. If you do not see an invoice in your email, please check your junk files. Payments that are not received by September 15th are subject to a \$15 late fee. Accounts not paid within 30 days are subject to suspension and a \$25 reconnection fee. TRASH COLLECTION REMINDERS: Please remember to have your trash, recycling, and yard debris out no later than 6 am, you may also place it the night before collection. What gets collected has also been a source of discussion. Regular household trash is all that should go into the trash. Please do NOT put ANY dead animals into the trash, as Champion does not collect them. Dead Animals Removal: Here is a link for information on removal of dead animals: Animal Carcass Disposal | Public Works and Environmental Services (fairfaxcounty.gov)

YARD DEBRIS may be placed in paper bags or a reusable container (though Champion prefers paper bags) for curbside collection. You may also dispose of small branches in lengths of no more than 4' and in bundles reasonable for one person to pick up. Shrubbery, tree stumps, clumps of dirt, etc. are NOT collected. RECYCLING: Fairfax County recycles quite a bit, but much of it is not collected curbside. For curbside, you may place: metal cans, and #1 and #2 plastic, paper (though not food containers like pizza boxes).
